



On 16th January there was a severe escalation in violent clashes between Arab tribes and Masalit tribes in West Darfur, resulting in many villages as well as Krinding IDP Camp in Geneina suffering over 200 fatalities according to the last updates and many more injured. More than 90,000 individuals remain displaced due to the burning of shelter and housing.

Our team, based in Geneina, was particularly impacted with several team members losing their homes, losing their family member and friends. With sadness we also lost a team member, who was killed alongside his wife and eldest son in Krinding camp. He is survived by 4 children, who face the future in the care of their extended family.

We grieve for this tragedy and for the brothers and sisters, the mothers and fathers, the community leaders and the friends we have lost during this conflict. We are grateful for the thoughts and kind words of support from our community in Sudan. We continue to work closely with our partners in West Darfur to provide emergency relief items, and remain committed to supporting and assisting our community to rebuild.

TGH is deeply concerned with the escalation in violence, and we urge those involved to seek peaceful resolutions.

TGH wishes to send the greatest of condolences to all those who suffered loss during these days of violence. And particularly to our NGO colleagues, to our community and to all those around us who have also felt the cruel blow of these recent days, we stand strong and we stand together.
